Hatherleigh Golf Course

Set in natural bushland, 15km north of Millicent, nine-hole par 3 course is available year round. Sheltered course provides relaxing but challenging golf.

The Living History Museum

1 Mount Gambier Road, Millicent

The museum has evolved around the old school house, built in 1873, where the Millicent, Victoriana, Aboriginal and Natural History Rooms are located and houses the largest collection in South Australia of fully restored horse-drawn vehicles. Other displays include the Shipwreck Room, restored farm implements, a T-Class locomotive, a coin-operated water wheel, blacksmith's shop and interactive drainage display. Entrance to the museum is via the Millicent Visitor Information Centre.

Open: Daily 9.00 am to 5.00 pm; Weekends and Public Holidays 10.00am to 4.00pm; Closed Christmas Day

Millicent Art Gallery and Library

Ridge Terrace

The Gallery has an A Class rating and features local, regional, state and national exhibitions on a regular basis. Visit one of the best country libraries in the state with free internet access and training. Take time out to research your family history and browse through the extensive local history collection. It is adjacent to the Millicent Civic and Arts Centre.

Windblade display & Woakwine Range Windfarms

Get up close and personal and marvel at the 33m wind blade in Centennial Park, adjacent the Visitor Centre. Continue on your journey of exploration along the Woakwine Range, view the spectacular wind turbines, take in the spectacular views and scenery of Lake Bonney and Canunda National Park.

Kanawinka Geopark

Kanawinka Geopark Millicent is the western Gateway to the Kanawinka Geopark, which extends from Millicent almost to Melbourne. Mt Muirhead, the large hill that dominates Millicent is one of the oldest volcanoes in this volcanic region. Mt Burr, Mt McIntyre and The Bluff are other features. Walking Trails and lookouts have been developed at Lake Leake and Lake Edward and provide visitors with panoramic views of the surrounding area. Geopark brochures are available at all Visitor Information Centres in the area.

Domain Mega Playground

Ridge Terrace, Millicent

An exciting modern, adventure space, providing equipment catering for all age groups and people with varied interests and ability. Children will delight in this newly developed playground with wheel chair access to some of the playground equipment, a liberty swing and outdoor exercise equipment for use by adults. 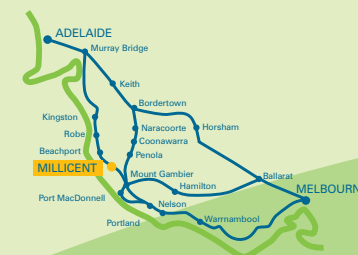

about millicent

Millicent is a prosperous and vibrant community located in the heart of the Limestone Coast region of South Australia. A great place to visit, relax in and explore.

A wide range of facilities and services make Millicent the ideal location to accommodate all visitors.

Millicent was proclaimed in 1870 when a township developed on the limestone ridge in the centre of the newly drained Millicent Flats.

It is named after Millicent Glen, wife of one of the early pioneers and daughter of the Anglican Bishop of Adelaide. Millicent moved into the 20th Century as a rural centre and its identity began to develop when pine plantations were developed in the ranges near the township.

Millicent is the western gateway to the Kanawinka Geopark and to some of the region's most unique attractions.

[Canunda National Park](#), one of the largest coastal parks in South Australia, is only minutes away, as are the [Tantanoola Caves](#), often hailed as one of the prettiest caves in Australia. Millicent also acts as a gateway to the Southern Ports, which include [Southend](#) and [Beachport](#).

The [Millicent Visitor Information Centre](#) sells a variety of local craft, produce and gifts to cater for visitors and is also the entrance to the award winning [Living History Museum](#).

walking trails

Walking Trail brochures are available at the Millicent Visitor Information Centre. Some of the spectacular and exciting walks that Millicent have to offer are:

Historic Walk through Millicent (1km)

🕒 45min 📊 Moderate

Enjoy a short stroll through Millicent's streets and see our historic buildings, beautiful town gardens and artist street murals depicting the history of the town.

Coola Outstation Historical Hike (8.5km)

Located 3km from Millicent

🕒 45min 📊 Moderate

This walking trail loop passes coastal vegetation, early farm machinery, wetlands (via a boardwalk) and the ruins of Coola Outstation to the shores of Lake Bonney. Along the way, splendid views of the lake, dunes and farm lands are captured.

Lake McIntyre (1.3Km)

🕒 20min 📊 Easy

Enjoy the general surrounds of Lake McIntyre during your leisurely walk and identify species of flora and fauna. Seats have been provided in several locations, and the trail provides access to two bird hides.

must see & do

Lake McIntyre Corner Rendelsham and Saleyards Roads

Lake McIntyre is a native wildlife and vegetation reserve, created from an old quarry. The area is a haven for birds which are visible in their natural habitat from bird hides along the walk. Free BBQ's and picnic area, walking trails and toilets are all accessible by wheelchair. Open dawn until dusk year round.

Millicent Swimming Lake *Park Terrace, Millicent*

The Swimming Lake is a man-made lake, an ideal summer venue, free for people of all ages to enjoy. Features a pontoon, kiosk, playground equipment, ample shaded areas, toilets and showers.

Tantanoola Cave Conservation Park *Highway 1, 16kms south east of Millicent*

The Tantanoola Cave features easy access pathways, a wide entrance and strategically placed lighting, which enhances the cave's natural beauty. The Tantanoola Cave is recognised as one of the finest single chamber caves in Australia. Open September to October 7 days a week, May to August Saturday, Sunday and Monday only 10am to 3pm for self guided tours. A guide is onsite. Wheelchair access. Fees apply.

The Millicent Golf Course

One of the top 100 courses in Australia located 12km from Millicent. 18-hole golf course set in picturesque natural bush land surrounded by wildlife with undulating watered fairways. Phone 08 8734 8124

Canunda National Park *13 kms west of Millicent*

The Canunda National Park, 40 kms long is South Australia's second largest coastal park, stretching from Southend in the north to Carpenter Rocks in the south. Features spectacular sand dune systems, open beaches, historic shell middens, scenic rugged coastlines and cliff tops. Walking trails, boardwalk and lookouts. Experience the challenging 4-Wheel Driving tracks. Coastal conditions are constantly changing. Enquire at the Millicent Visitor Information Centre for maps and information.

Two Wheel Drive

Access to Cape Buffon and Boozy Gully from Southend and Oil Rig Square/ Geltwood Beach via Millicent. Rugged limestone cliffs, spectacular sea vistas, sea-stacks and offshore reefs can be viewed from the 3 walking trails in the northern section of Canunda National Park. Great fishing spots.

Four Wheel Drive Vehicles

Experience the challenging 4Wheel Drive tracks - detailed maps with numbered posts and GPS points for Canunda National Park, Beachport Conservation Park and Little Dip Conservation Park are available at Information Centres. The coastal conditions are constantly changing - be aware the beaches are very soft with shifting sands and blowouts. Weather conditions can change quickly, please check tide times. Contact National Park Ranger 08 8735 6053 for current information. Remember to protect the environment by staying on the tracks.
