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Executive Summary

The intent of this plan is for the community of Penola to get together and develop a road map that will influence the future of the region for the next 20 years.

The Penola Community Plan enables Our Community in partnership with the Council, to place an importance on future development, creating business and tourism opportunities, strengthening communities and valuing lifestyle throughout the region. From this strong foundation, The Penola Region will continue to be a thriving region of opportunity where our communities enjoy a vibrant lifestyle in 2030 and beyond.

The community outcomes and projects listed in this plan will drive council's future strategic direction and approach to future development and the delivery of services. Council's comprehensive Community Plan and other strategic documents will be directly influenced by this plan. This will help ensure all council activities are responsive to the views and aspirations of local residents and businesses.

The Penola Community Plan has been developed to provide a vision and framework for the future development of Penola. A progressive Community working towards a sustainable environmental, social and economic future for all. This Plan has been developed in consultation with business, residents and the wider community who have an interest in Penola and how it will look, feel and operate into the future.

The History of Penola

In 1836, the first new settlers arrived at Holdfast Bay now part of Adelaide, with the intent to form the new State of South Australia.

In the south east of the state, the historic town of Penola, the oldest town located in the Limestone Coast, was first settled by Alexander Cameron in 1844 and greatly influenced by John Riddoch who planted the first vines and built the magnificent homestead Yallum Park in 1880.

By 1848, the original Royal Oak Hotel was built followed by the first Catholic Church, Telegraph Station, the original Prince of Wales Hotel, Woods MacKillop Schoolhouse, original Post Office and local shops, servicing the needs of the growing population both in the town and surrounding district as well as travelers moving to the Victorian goldfields.

Penola's early association in the mid to late 19th century with the lives of three colonial poets; Adam Lindsay Gordon, John Shaw Neilson and Will Ogilvie has led to a strong literary and arts focus in Our Community.

Over many years, Penola has evolved into a vibrant township and now boasts a reputation as a “must go to” destination for locals, people within the Limestone Coast and much further afield.

The creation of the first fruit colony in Coonawarra in the 1890's, which later became the Coonawarra wine region, within 10kms of Penola, has also impacted on the town and district, bringing with it employment opportunities in the wine sector, as well as the many wine related events throughout the year.



Penola Today

Penola today is a district recognized as unique, authentic and vibrant due to our distinctive natural features, historical buildings, literary past, arts culture, local wine region, mix of community, sporting culture, small businesses and primary industry.

We are a historical tourist town, whose tourism is based on history, food, wine, art galleries, unique shopping and festivals supported by a diverse range of accommodation options.

Weekends in Penola and Coonawarra are busy with the many shops, restaurants, cafés, galleries and wineries, open for business.

Our town boasts many sporting clubs, catering for both young and old, Service Clubs, two Primary Schools, a Secondary School, a Childcare Centre and Early Learning Centre.

We have a well-utilised Community Library and an active National Trust who care for the many local historical buildings and artifacts, have a comprehensive local history collection and a National Trust Herb Garden.

Penola is a unique blend of history and progressive ideas, young and old and all work together as a community, for the common good of its residents.

The unemployment rate is low in Penola, with many of the local jobs in the Agricultural, viticulture, horticulture and retail sectors, as well as the food services sector.

Why the need for Town Plan?

As a town and district, Penola has much to offer and it has been decided by the Penola and District Business Association, (PDBATA), that the creation of a Town Plan with input from the many organizations within our district, will give a blueprint to move forward and work together to create an even better environment and facilities for our residents. The plan will ensure a coordinated approach to the future development of Penola and ensure the community have an active voice in what the region looks like, going into the future.

Town planning is important for any region. By consolidating the community's opinions it is possible to make best use of financial and community resources to ensure a cohesive approach to future development.

What Makes Penola unique?

Penola is a historic town – A town where history meets arts, craft, festivals, culture, business and primary industry.

Renowned for its open space, large red gums, gourmet food and world class wine, Penola is charming town that has a friendly vibe, sporting culture and a real community spirit.

The town boasts a link to sainthood as the place that encouraged and inspired by Father Julian Tenison Woods, Saint Mary of the Cross Mackillop then known as Mary Helen MacKillop opened the first Saint Joseph's School in a disused stable and co-founded With Father Julian The Sisters of St Joseph of The Sacred Heart and is a destination for pilgrims and those interested in its historical and literary past. With a proud history, the town is well placed to grow into the future, maintaining the current charm and characteristics and building on the infrastructure, services and ensuring a vibrant economy with low unemployment.

Location

Penola is a town 388 km southeast of Adelaide in the heart of one of South Australia's most productive wine growing areas. The Coonawarra region lies just to the north and is renowned for the quality of its red wines, made famous by the Terra Rosa strip. Penola has a population of 1,317 people.

Products and Services

Penola is world renowned for Saint Mary of The Cross MacKillop; The Mary MacKillop Interpretive Centre is located in Penola. It is within close proximity to the two State Heritage sites of Petticoat Lane and the original stone schoolhouse developed by Mary MacKillop in conjunction with Father Julian Tenison Woods in the 1800s. This along with an array of local produce, fine food and Penola / Coonawarra wine, positions Penola as a unique township with low unemployment and a multitude of activities and products to attract tourists, day trippers and visitors from surrounding towns.

The town is serviced by a supermarket, has bank branches, bakeries, cafes, retail outlets and cellar doors on the Coonawarra straight.

From an accommodation perspective, the town has motels, a caravan park, hotels and an array of diverse bed and breakfasts. There is also accommodation for backpackers and self-contained caravans and motor homes are catered for with a dump point adjacent to Rymill Hall and a designated overnight parking location at Greenrise.

The township is blessed with open space. With both formal spaces including Memorial Park and the soon to be Penola Town Square, through to designated open space and the arboretum at Greenrise.

The town is serviced by a Visitor Information Centre, which also acts as a local Council Office for Penola.

Penola has a community hospital, medical centre, pharmacy, two part time dental clinics and part time physiotherapist. Whilst it is acknowledged the town is fortunate to have the services, demographics show that Penola has an ageing demographic, so these services will be critical into the future and will need further resources to cater for not only current residents, but future community expansion.

Agriculture pursuits are the staple of employment opportunities in Penola and the surrounding areas. The famous Terra Rosa soils of the Coonawarra border Penola,

producing some of the most famous red wines in the world. Beef, lamb, dairy, timber, potatoes and vegetables are also produced in the region. The addition of Midfield Group Coonawarra to the Town and their development to process powdered milk, will see a boost to employment opportunities and create new business opportunities.

The main street of Penola comes alive on weekends. The cafes, shops, galleries and tourist attractions prove to be a hive of activity. Drawing tourists, day trippers and the local community out in force. Compared to many other towns in the Limestone Coast, Penola is a hub of activity on weekends; with the majority of businesses open on the weekend to encourage a steady stream of visitors.

Who do we need to attract to Penola?

For Penola to prosper into the future a broad cross section of people and services need to be encouraged to live, visit and be based within Penola.

This includes but is not limited to:

- Residents (Intergenerational)
- Tourists
- New Businesses
- New medical and health services (Penola could become a hub with its location)
- Additional accommodation options; especially conference and 5 star facilities
- Artisans to live, work and sell their wares in Penola.
- Maintaining the arts and Cultural focus and encouraging more events and artists
- Build on the variety of unique retail options in Penola and the ability the town has to come alive on weekends
- More services and supports for the local community
- Maintain our youth and ensure suitable job opportunities are available in the future.

The success of any town is built on having a sustainable population. Sustainable populations are supported by employment, an active community spirit and a town with appropriate services to sustain a broad cross section of the community.

A sustainably growing town will support new housing development, increased infrastructure and allow the community to have increased services locally rather than having to travel to other towns.

Marketing & Promotion

One of the key areas identified in the community planning process is the need for Penola to promote itself and the attractions that it has.

Penola has a lot to offer, however marketing and promotion will play a pivotal role in attracting future residents, tourists and businesses to the region.

Whilst Penola is ideally located as a central hub, 50km's from Mount Gambier, 50 Km's from Millicent and 50km's from Naracoorte, there is a real risk when the bypass is completed that Penola becomes a drive around town, rather than a destination that people come to explore and stay in.

Increased promotion should aim to create Penola as a base for people exploring the Limestone Coast. This will enhance the current weekend activity into more weekday trade for business and as a result, increased services for locals as well as the tourist trade.

Working in conjunction with Wattle Range Council, The South Australian Tourism Commission and PIRSA, there needs to be a coordinated approach to marketing and selling the region. This must be inclusive of a tourist campaign, as well as business attraction to the region.
